The Northern Isles are breath-taking and wild, rich in Norse and Scottish history, wildlife, unique folklore, music, poetry and prose. They may feel a long way away but with NorthLink Ferries they're closer than you think.

Discovering the islands has never been easier as NorthLink Ferries operates up to three sailings a day to Orkney and Shetland. Sailings routinely depart from Scrabster (near Thurso) to Stromness in Orkney and there are nightly sailings from Aberdeen to Lerwick in Shetland. Up to four sailings from Aberdeen also travel via Orkney's capital; Kirkwall.

For islanders and visitors alike, NorthLink Ferries provides a luxurious and comfortable service that provides a vital link to and from mainland Scotland. NorthLink's modern passenger vessels are equipped to cater to passengers' needs and on board, travellers can expect a service that is a testament to the islands' warmth and friendliness.

Meals served on board are all prepared using as much locally-sourced produce as possible. On board shopping facilities provide passengers with the opportunity to purchase a keepsake from their visit or a gift for a family member or friend. All ships include plenty of activities to keep the children entertained; including the Vikling's Den which has a range of activities for children of all ages to enjoy.

NorthLink Ferries prides itself on making journeys as comfortable as possible. Passengers can choose from various sleeping options, including two and four berth en-suite cabins, sleeping pods and reclining seats. Shower facilities are also available onboard to ensure you reach your destination refreshed and rejuvenated. A range of accessible facilities are available to allow easy access for all passengers. These include specially designed cabins, accessible toilets, wheelchair access and boarding assistance.

NorthLink Ferries operate three passenger ships – MV Hjaltland and MV Hrossey serving Kirkwall and Lerwick, whilst MV Hamnavoe sails on the Pentland Firth between Scrabster and Stromness.

Travelling from Aberdeen

Aberdeen is well connected to the rest of Scotland and the UK by road, air and rail. The ferry terminal is conveniently located in the heart of the city, close to the rail and bus stations at Union Square.

NorthLink Ferries has partnered with bus operator, Stagecoach, to offer passengers an onward bus – the 727 Jet Bus – to Aberdeen International Airport. The service operates Monday to Friday, departing the Ferry Terminal at 07:42 and arriving at the Airport at 08:34. On Saturday and Sunday, it leaves at 07:20 and arrives at 08:02. ...to Lerwick

NorthLink Ferries operates a daily service to Lerwick, leaving Aberdeen in the evening and arriving at 07:30 the following morning in Shetland's capital.

...to Kirkwall

NorthLink Ferries also operate a direct link to Orkney from Aberdeen. The service to Kirkwall departs on a Tuesday*, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday evening, calling into Kirkwall at 23:00 before departing for Lerwick.

Travelling from Scrabster

Scrabster is in the far north of Mainland Scotland near Thurso in Caithness. There are road, rail and bus links to Thurso from Inverness, which is well connected to the rest of Scotland.

...to Stromness

NorthLink Ferries operate a 90-minute crossing three times a day in the peak period between Scrabster and Stromness. During off-peak periods and at weekends there are two return crossings a day. Take MV Hamnavoe to Orkney to enjoy the spectacular view of the famous sea stack, the Old Man of Hoy, and the red sandstone cliffs of St John's Head.

Average travel distances/times by car:

Glasgow (146 miles) / Edinburgh (126 miles) to Aberdeen 3 hours

Inverness to Scrabster (112 miles) 3 hours

Stromness to Kirkwall (15 miles) 30 minutes

Explore the Orkney Islands

With green rolling fields bordered by huge seascapes, Orkney has an incredible allure and huge range of attractions. Visitors can enjoy extraordinary remains of villages, stone circles and tombs and the sunken fleet at Scapa Flow whilst sampling wonderful food and drink. An abundance of entertainment and activities on offer include festivals and shows, island-hopping, golf at midnight, traditional music and crafts and of course spectacular wildlife watching.



The Old Man of Hoy

Standing at 449ft, The Old Man of Hoy is one of Orkney's best-known landmarks. The iconic red sandstone stack is over 200 years old and popular amongst climbers due to its challenging environment. The stack can be seen when sailing on MV Hamnavoe, the only ferry to sail past the Old Man of Hoy.



The Churchill Barriers

Linking the mainland of Orkney to the South Isles, the Churchill Barriers were built in 1940 as naval defences following the sinking of the Royal Oak. Reaching almost two kilometres in length, the four causeways now serve as road links, carrying the A961 road from Kirkwall to Burwick.



Skara Brae

Discovered under a sand dune after a windstorm in 1850, Skara Brae is a settlement of ten clustered houses which were occupied over 5,000 years ago. The stone-built furniture has been perfectly preserved in the sand; cupboards, beds and boxes are all intact. Older than the pyramids - Skara Brae is one of the must-see attractions of Orkney, offering an amazing alimpse into Neolithic life.



The Italian Chapel

Built in 1943 by Italian prisoners of war (who were working at the time on The Churchill Barriers), the Italian chapel was built out of two Nissen huts, concrete and scrap metal. The tabernacle was made from wood obtained from a wrecked ship and the light holders made out of corned beef tins. The interior was exquisitely painted by Domenico Chiocchetti, a gifted painter from Moena, Italy.

Standing Stones of Stenness and the Ring of Brodgar

The Standing Stones of Stenness and the Ring of Brodgar are two very different sets of Neolithic standing stones, three quarters of a mile apart in the West Mainland of Orkney. The four Standing Stones of Stenness are monstrously tall at five metres high and were erected 5,000 years ago. The Ring of Brodgar is a larger yet younger ring of 30 standing stones, which may have been built to accommodate more people. The purpose of both are unknown, but just as churches today are used for various events, it is likely that the stone circles served a number of roles.

Discover the Shetland Islands

Shetland is a place of drama. "Nature" wrote one visitor, "appears in her wildest dress" in these, Britain's most northerly islands, and it is indeed the wildness and grandeur of the Shetland landscapes and seascapes which inevitably become visitors' most enduring memory.

There are more than 100 islands here, each forged by the roaring surging waves of the North Atlantic. Everywhere one goes, there are dramatic cliffs, perfect deserted beaches, huge vistas across awe-inspiring voes and inlets, and above, the cry of seabirds.

Jarlshof

An impressive archaeological site which was occupied for millennia. Excavation proved to be rather difficult, as the site is layered, with later generations of dwellers building on top of previous houses and reusing materials. Remarkable survivors of this site include Neolithic pottery, round houses and an Iron Age broch built close to the shore. Pictish influences can be seen, and there are seven Norse houses. Jarlshof has a longhouse, several outbuildings for sheltering domesticated animals and a sauna from Viking times. On top of it all sits a medieval house. Jarlshof is a superb place to learn about the history of Shetland.





Sumburgh Head

Sumburgh Head is a 100m high cliff at the southern tip of the Shetland Mainland. Tidal streams from the east and west meet here, and the mixing of water provides food for seabirds and whales. As a result, Sumburgh is an RSPB reserve noted as an excellent place to see puffins (from May to July). Humpback, Killer and Minke whales can sometimes be spotted from the cliff top in summer. The lighthouse has recently been converted into a great visitor's centre where you can learn about Shetland's birdlife and marine life, and the history and mechanics of running a lighthouse.

Scalloway Castle

Built in 1599 and occupied for only a short time, Scalloway Castle is a great place to explore. From the main hall to the dungeon, each room has a wealth of history that visitors can learn about as they wander.



Up Helly Aa

Up Helly Aa is on the last Tuesday of January. A procession of 1,000 men with flaming torches, led by the Viking Jarl Squad, circle and set fire to a Viking Galley! For those that don't manage to make the event itself, the Galley Shed exhibition in Lerwick provides a plethora of information about this thrilling festival.



St Ninian's Isle St Ninian's Isle is joined to the Shetland mainland at Bigton by a beautiful sandy tombolo or spit, the largest in the United Kingdom. St Ninian's Isle has featured twice in the BBC's Shetland series.

Services On Board: Scrapster - Stromness

Served by MV Hamnavoe, the 90-minute Scrabster to Stromness route is the only sailing to travel past the iconic Old Man of Hoy and St John's Head landmarks.

These sailings offer a range of onboard facilities including a restaurant, Magnus' Lounge and the Northern Isles gift shop selling local newspapers, snacks, gifts, books, fragrances and travel products.

The Vikling's Den is a great dedicated play area for children to enjoy fancy dress costumes, TV showing children's cartoons, books and colouring pads.

Food and Drink

Passengers can enjoy a variety of delicious freshly prepared meals, using locally sourced produce in the onboard Feast restaurant. For £9.95, adults can enjoy an all-inclusive breakfast or a continental breakfast is available for £6.95. For every adult breakfast purchased, up to two children (under 16) can eat breakfast for free.

A three-course meal can be pre-booked for a special rate of £17.25, or purchased individually on board. Children can choose from a variety of meals priced at £5.25 and served in a NorthLink Ferry boat with new potatoes or chips, Strathmore water or milk, and fruit or a Walls Calippo.

Magnus' Lounge

Magnus' Lounge on MV Hamnavoe offers the perfect space to work or unwind. For just £7.50 you will receive complimentary tea, coffee, soft drinks, nibbles, newspapers and magazines. On morning sailings hot filled rolls are on offer and during afternoon sailings, passengers can relax with a complimentary drink. Main meals are also available to purchase in Magnus' Lounge.

Bed & Breakfast

The Hamnavoe bed & breakfast offer is a great way to get a good night's sleep before departing from Stromness on the 06:30 or 09:00 sailing. Passengers can board the ship between 21:30 and 23:30 and enjoy a drink or a complimentary snack in the comfortable setting of Magnus' Lounge.

MV Hamnavoe features 16 cabins, with all featuring two or four berths and en-suite facilities. Cabins come with premium linens

Food and Drink

NorthLink Ferries' tasty and diverse menu boasts the best of locally sourced food. There are a number of options for eating and drinking on board to suit your needs – you can order from the main restaurant, called The Feast, in Magnus' Lounge or the Midship Bar. There are also vending machines on board offering tea, coffee, soft drinks and snacks.

Meal deal options are available to pre book offering cost savings on a three-course dinner or dinner and breakfast package.

On arrival into Lerwick or Aberdeen, there is no need to rush off the ship in the morning, ensuring you can enjoy a leisurely breakfast to start your day. Take advantage of our Kids Eat Free offer where for every adult breakfast purchased, up to two children (under 16) can eat breakfast for free. While car drivers need to be ready to disembark their vehicle on arrival, other passengers are welcome to stay on board, and drivers may return on board after unloading. Breakfast is served until 09:00 and you can remain on board until 09:30.

Accommodation

Conveniently sailing overnight between Aberdeen and Lerwick and regularly calling into Kirkwall, the Hjaltland and Hrossey offer a variety of accommodation options to suit every budget.

Cabins

A range of en-suite cabin options is available. These include two and four berth cabins for exclusive use or to share with friends or family and cabins for those with restricted mobility. There is also the option to buy a berth in a shared cabin with other passengers.

Executive and Premium cabins are available, featuring satellite TV, luxury towels, Shetland wool blankets, local newspapers, complimentary Mirrie Dancers Chocolates, Caithness shortbread and bottled water. Both of these cabin options provide you with complimentary access to Magnus' Lounge.

Sleeping Pod

If you want a good night's sleep without the cost of your own cabin, sleeping pods are a great alternative at just £18. A reclining chair with foot support and added privacy, they come with a large table, adjustable lighting and a USB socket to charge mobile devices. A blanket, pillow, eye mask and token for access to the shower facilities are also provided.

Reclining Seats

Reclining seats are available in the Longship Lounge and on the port side of the vessel, and these can be reserved for you at the time of booking. A blanket and pillow can be hired from the shop.

Showers

Shower tokens are available from reception desk or any till point on board for £3. A towel can also be hired for £2 plus a £5 returnable deposit.

Magnus' Lounge

The comfortable Magnus' Lounge offers the perfect space to work or unwind. For $\pounds 18.50$ (departing Aberdeen or Lerwick) or $\pounds 14.00$ (departing Kirkwall, you will receive complimentary tea, coffee, soft drinks, nibbles and two vouchers for a beverage of your choice.

Open until 01:30, Magnus' Lounge reopens in the morning where a complimentary continental breakfast is served, or you can upgrade to full Scottish Breakfast.

Children's Play Area

The Vikling's Den offers a dedicated, friendly place for little Viklings to play. Toys, games, dress-up, colouring and activity pads, and a TV showing cartoons and other children's programmes are available to keep your young Viklings entertained.

The valet service allows drivers who would rather not drive their car on or off the ferry to board as a foot passenger. For £19.25 your car will be loaded before departure and then unloaded as you reach your destination, leaving your key to be collected from the ship's reception desk.
